Over the past 2 academic years, we have used our PE grant in various different ways. COVID-19 has obviously had a significant impact on all schools, and has resulted in changes to spend. An example of this is the fact there has been no interschool competitions or participation events for over 12 months, greatly reducing opportunities for all schools. In terms of what we have been able to spend on, we have bought in Northumberland Cricket Board coaching staff to team teach with our KS2 PE team; we have used CPD opportunities provided by our SLA with Newcastle PE & School Sport Service buying in the Silver level SLA over both academic years, which has allowed to use their expertise across a range of PE opportunities and development. We have used a company called Positive Energy North East to deliver Metafit training to children from Reception up to Year 6 across the last 2 years. Children throughout school have responded extremely positively to this training, something they had previously not experienced. We have bought in the expertise of Ian Kendall to work with a KS2 PE team whilst team cycling and to provide support on cycling trips outside of school, and prior to the initial lockdown of March 2020 had been taking a group of children horse riding at Stepney Bank Stables.

We have tapped into our grant to improve the overall playtime experience for all of our children. We have invested in playground equipment to increase opportunities available on our playground. Our SLA with Newcastle PE & SSS allowed us to train up our cohort of Playground & Sports Leaders, and this SLA also allowed us to assess a host of year groups across 3 key fundamental areas.

Our grant has allowed us to replenish our equipment stores which had become depleted over time; we have invested in updated football and rugby equipment, and introduced indoor curling to school, again something children are responding to positively. We have tapped in to the grant to greatly upgrade our cycling equipment. We now as a school own over 50 children's bikes, several staff bikes and over 15 balance bikes, allowing us to teach cycling skills throughout school from Nursery to Year 6, in some cases being able to have whole year groups out cycling at the same time. We have still been able to take some children out on cycling trips even throughout the pandemic, which has been proved to be both motivation and a reward in these testing times. In addition, to improve our sports day experience we purchased a gold medal for each participant. This was extremely well received by all learners and staff as well as parents present, and led to a real sense of achievement for all of our children.
